APIIPv6TF principles

- Serving member economies in the AP region to support smooth IPv6 transition
 - Bring people together through remote participation tools
 - Encourage members to support each other in transiting to IPv6

- exec@ap-ipv6tf.org
 - Established in 2003 for the steering committee
 - Used for wider scope of membership
 - Manually maintained mailing list
 - Results many bounce back “unused” email addresses
- ap-ipv6tf@lists.ap-ipv6tf.org
 - Established in June 2010 to replace exec@ap-ipv6tf.org
 - Managed by mailman
 - Subscription and un-subscription by users’ intention
 - Provide transparency through archives
 - Smoothly transitioning to this new mailing list

 - Established in 2003
 - Managed courtesy of TWNIC
 - Need to identify low maintenance website
 - The Secretariat has limited resources

 - Use of Social Networking Site concept?
